Across-The-Board Increases At Nor Cal Yearling Sale

Bucking downward industry trends, this year's CTBA Sales' Northern California Yearling Sale held on August 11, showed significant increases from last year's sale in gross, average and median.

The event, the sixth presented in Northern California in its current format by the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association, returned to the Alameda County Fairgrounds in

Pleasanton after one year at the Sonoma County Fairgrounds in Santa Rosa. In Tuesday's sale, 110 individuals brought gross sales of \$566,000, an average price of \$5,146 and a median price of \$3,250.

The previous year, there were 106 sold for a \$504,700 gross, a \$4,761 average and a \$2,500 median. This year's results reflect increases of 12 percent in the gross, eight percent in the average and 30 percent in the median. The buybacks dropped from 81 (43 percent) to 46 (29 percent).

"We were pleased with the across-theboard increases and were very encouraged with the drastic decrease in the buy-back rate," said Doug Burge, the Executive Vice

President and General Manager of the CTBA. "We believe the new additions to the California incentive program have assisted in creating more demand for California-breds."

The sale topper was Hip #132, a colt by Benchmark, out of the Deputy Minister mare Brief Interlude and a half-brother to the

stakes-placed Ran for the Dough. He was consigned by River Edge Farm Inc., Agent, bred by Pam and Martin Wygod and purchased by Sierra Sunset LLC for \$32,000.

Next, and the top-selling filly, was Hip #128, by Perfect Mandate, out of the winning Bertrando mare Bertsgirl, consigned by Colleen Turpin-Boyce, Agent for Rancho de los Aviadores. She

was bred by late Dick Probert and his wife Nancy and purchased by Richard Franco for \$27,000.

Hip #52, purchased for \$26,000, is a filly by Redattore (Brz), out of the winning Cee's Tizzy mare Nora Ellen, consigned by breeder Harris Farms Inc. and bought by Carole Chaiken, Chaiken Family Trust.

Trainer Art Sherman purchased Hip #114 for \$25,000. The Tannersmyman colt is out of the stakes-placed Storm Boot mare Yourfinalanswer, was bred by Jim Eaton and consigned by Woodbridge Farm.

The final sale of at least \$20,000 was

Hip #72, an E Dubai filly out of the winning Tabasco Cat mare Satin Dolly, consigned by Green Acres Stables Inc. (Jack and Barb Hatch), Agent, bred by Jon Denson and purchased by Bill Wilbur for \$20,000.

Producers Looking For 'Secretariat'

In preparation for the shooting later this year of the upcoming Walt Disney Pictures' movie "Secretariat", Mayhem Pictures, the producers of the film, will conduct an open, online "casting call" for horses to portray the legendary 1973 Triple Crown winner.

Interested horse owners may email photographs of their equine, big-screen hopeful to casting@secretariat.com. Applicants must also complete an online Secretariat casting form at www.secretariat.com, where additional information about the casting call can also be found. All photographs will be per-

sonally reviewed by the lead wrangler for "Secretariat", Rusty Hendrickson, who was also in charge of horse selection for such recent major motion pictures as "Seabiscuit" and "Dreamer".

"The three main qualities I'm looking for in a horse to portray Secretariat are looks, temperament and soundness," said Hendrickson. "A big flashy chestnut would obviously have an inherent advantage, but I'm going to need at least two main Secretariats and perhaps four stand-ins. I know that he was one of a kind, but we'll do

the best we can. A calm temperament is particularly key, especially when multiple takes are involved. But applicants need not feel that they must have an identical looking horse to be considered. We can do wonders with equine makeup for the white facial markings and the three white socks. Our horses need to be sound but racing experience is not a necessity. And Secretariat's short back and round hip are somewhat reminiscent of American Quarter Horses, so owners of that breed should also feel free to make submissions."

Atticus Kristy Takes My Frenchman

Odds-on favorite Atticus Kristy, a Kentucky-bred son of California stallion Atticus, won Saturday's \$60,000 My Frenchman Stakes at Monmouth Park.

Atticus Kristy has 14 wins in 62 starts with earnings of \$761,050. He ran the $5\frac{1}{2}$ furlongs on turf in 1:02.13 and won by a length at odds of 4-5.



Spotlight Your Farm In Our September Issue.

California Thoroughbred Ranch Sub Heading


Nestled in rolling hills adjacent to the horse-related community of Santa Theresita, you will find one of the oldest and most beautiful homages to the Thoroughbred in this state, California Thoroughbred Ranch.

Now in its fourth decade of operation, the ranch was built from the ground up by Jack and Susie Farmer who still own the beautiful facility and

live right on the premises. Once an abandoned alfalfa field, the ranch is a striking portrayal of early California architecture, right down to the adobe and mission-style construction of the barns and office complex.

The main barn contains stalls for 40 horses in training and the foaling barn comes equipped with closed circuit television monitors that are linked up to the farm manager's office and residence 24 hours a day. Newborns are kept in stalls with their dams for the first 36 hours of life and monitored closely. After that, they are moved outdoors to grassy paddocks and pastures. The region's temperate climate allows for horses to live outdoors year-round, and the ranch's pastures range from two acres to almost 50 and follow the contours of the foothills.

To date, more than 200 stakes winners have been foaled and raised on the ranch's green fields. Others like last year's Eclipse champion juvenile colt Valid Point, were brought to the ranch as yearlings for breaking and schooling. California Thoroughbred Ranch also has an excellent reputation as a training center. It



offers five round pens, an indoor riding arena and a scenic uphill gallop that winds its way through the facility. There are also two treadmills and a swimming pool, where lay-ups can regain their conditioning without risk of further injury.

The ranch is home to two of California's finest stallions. Super Dad is the sire of 22 graded stakes winners and countless other

stakes performers. His champion daughter Daddy's Little Gal captured last year's Cal Cup Juvenile Fillies and this year's grade I Santa Anita Oaks. Moneymaker was foaled at the ranch and now stands at stud here. This graded stakes winner of nearly \$400,000 has thrust himself into the national spotlight when his son Hayburner captured this year's Travers Stakes at Saratoga. Winner of the Wood Memorial and second in both the Kentucky Derby and Preakness Stakes, Hayburner now has earnings over \$1 million. The Cal-bred is now pointing for the Breeders' Cup Classic.

Farm manager Bob Trainer has more than 30 years of experience in this business and gives your horses the personal care and attention they deserve. Assistant manager and yearling trainer Steve Winner also has many years of veterinary experience, although the farm's main vet lives just down the road and is on call 24 hours a day, especially during the busy foaling season. Visitors are welcome and encouraged to come and tour the facilities. Also visit their impressive website at www.Califthoroughbredranch.com.
