Vessels Memorial Held Monday

Several hundred family members, friends and fellow horsemen gathered at Vessels Stallion Farm on August 16, for the memorial service of farm owner Frank "Scoop" Vessels III who died with friend Sam Cannell in a plane crash in Oregon on August 11.

Vessels was a Past President of both the California Thoroughbred

Breeders Association (CTBA) and the American Quarter Horse Association (AQUA). He also was on the CTBA's executive committee.

The one-hour ceremony was held in one of the paddocks at the picturesque Vessels Stallion Farm, where top Thoroughbred stallion In Excess (Ire) and top Quarter Horse stallion First Down Dash stand.

Attendees included a cross-section of representatives from both sectors of the horse racing community, members of the local community and those from the motorsports world in which Vessels participated.

The welcome and opening prayer was delivered by Reverend Tom Straeter, who called the farm "Scoop's cathedral."

Also at the podium were Bob Gordon (a childhood friend of Vessels and his off-road/horse industry partner) and Dennis Moore (another childhood friend who was the best man at Vessels' wedding to wife Bonnie), sharing memories of their friend.

Personal and farm memories were presented by Bill Thead, the Vice President of Vessels Stallion Farm, and Kevin Dickson, the Ranch Manager and Vessels' brother-in-law (having married Bonnie's sister).

Next at the podium were Vessels' three sons—Bryan, Kash and

Colt. Reverend Straeter read a message from Kash, while Colt delivered a heartfelt eulogy to his father.

Reverend Straeter then delivered a closing prayer.

The memorial booklet included this statement from the Vessels Family: "We would like to extend our most sincere thanks for your love and support as we move forward to continue our family legacy."

Vessels was the grandson of Los Alamitos Race Course founder Frank Vessels Sr. His grandfather moved to Orange County in 1920 and, after 20 years of owning a construction

company, built the racetrack on a 435-acre ranch. The track held its first Quarter Horse race in 1951, and the family owned and operated the track for 35 years. Vessels' mother, Mildred, managed the track for many years before selling it.

In 1986, Vessels turned a 2,000-acre cattle ranch in Bonsall

into what is now Vessels Stallion Farm, moving the family's horse operation from a small plot adjacent to Los Alamitos Race Course, with breeding his primary focus.

Vessels was also an avid off-road racer and is a member of the Off Road Motorsports Hall of Fame. He competed as an open-class pickup truck driver in SCORE racing in the '80s and '90s and was a previous winner of the grueling off-road races the Baja 500 and the Baja 1000, the San Diego Union Tribune reported.



Kafwain Colt Tops NorCal Yearling Sale

A bay California-bred colt by Kafwain brought the top price during this year's CTBA

Sales Northern California Yearling Sale at the Alameda County Fairgrounds in Pleasanton on August 17.

The colt, out of the multiple stakes-placed Great Above mare Way Up, was bred by Thomas Bachman, consigned by BTO and purchased for \$20,000 by Kjell Qvale. The March 9 foal is a half-brother to the stakes-placed Wavy Lass.

The highest-priced filly was by Bertrando and is the first foal out of the stakes-placed Tale of the Cat mare Unchanged Melody. She was bred by Pam and Marty Wygod, consigned by River Edge Farm, Agent, and purchased by GCCI for \$13,500.

Two yearlings sold for \$13,000: a chestnut colt by Cahill Road, out of the stakes-winning Bold Badgett mare Takes Two To Mango, consigned by Green Acre Stables, Agent for breeder SLU Inc., and purchased by Kjell Qvale; and a bay colt by In Excess (Ire), out of the winning Forty Niner mare Miner's Gal, consigned by breeder Harris Farms, Agent, and purchased by Kjell Qvale.

In Tuesday's sale, the seventh presented in Northern California in its current format by CTBA, 82 yearlings brought gross sales of \$357,400, an average of \$4,359 and a median price of \$3,000. Last year, 110 individuals brought gross sales of \$566,000, an average of \$5,145 and a median price of \$3,250. There were 53 buybacks this year compared to 46 last year.

The program is in place for California-Bred or Sired horses. Funded by the Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC), California Thoroughbred Breeders Association (CTBA) and the various racing associations, the program greatly increases the return for those investing in California-Bred or Sired horses. The goal of this program is to increase demand for California-Bred or Sired horses by significantly increasing the purse money and opportunities available for California-Bred or Sired horses. The backbone of this new program is the creation of a lucrative maiden bonus program, providing a quick return for those successfully racing California-Bred or Sired horses.

The program provides:

- A \$20,000 bonus made available for owners of registered California-Bred or Sired maidens in Maiden Special races at the Santa Anita, Hollywood Park and Del Mar meetings in Southern California; and
- 2. A \$10,000 bonus for owners of registered California-Bred or Sired maidens in Maiden Special races in Northern California and at all Fair meetings throughout the state for races of 4 1/2-furlongs or longer as of 2010, and for this year's Fairplex Park meet.

The bonus will go to the owner of the winner and will be paid directly by the CTBA within 30 days after the race.

If a California Bred wins an open Maiden Special race, the owner would also receive the current owner bonus available in open company as well as the new amount.

The various racing secretaries support this tremendous boost and have made a commitment to write and fill more California-bred and Sired Maiden Special races.

California Flag Gets The Green

In a blanket finish to end all blanket finishes, the California-bred even-money favorite California Flag, the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint champion from last November, prevailed by the narrowest of noses to defend his title by winning the featured \$102,175 Green Flash Handicap at the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club on August 18.

With six horses separated by

less than a length at the wire, California Flag and jockey Mike Smith won out after a furious stretch battle. Deadheating for second fellow were Cal-breds My Summer Slew and Quick Enough, with fourth-placed Cal-bred Cost of Freedom another half-length away. Lt. Hopeful, who set blistering early fractions, was fifth, another head back, while Stoneside (Ire) was only another neck away in sixth place in the eight-horse field.

Making it two straight victories in the Green Flash at five furlongs over the infield grass course, Hi Card Ranch's homebred California Flag sped the distance in :55.58 seconds under highweight of 124 pounds. His time last summer was :55.22 seconds.

California Flag, a six-year-old California-bred son of Avenue of Flags trained by Brian Koriner, returned \$4.20, \$2.60 and \$2.60 after his ninth win in 19 starts. First money of \$61,575 increased his bankroll to \$1,166,171.

Best Pal Inducted In Hall of Fame

California-bred champion Best Pal was inducted into the National Museum of Racing's Hall of Fame on August 13, with Larry Mabee delivering an emotional acceptance speech at the newly renovated Fasig-Tipton Sales Pavilion in Saratoga, New York.

"The only thing missing is my father, my dad," said Larry Mabee, son of Best Pal's breeders and owners John and Betty Mabee, as he

choked back tears.



"They would be so proud to be here. They loved their horses. He [Best Pal] got on a race track and he knew what his job was. He was there to race; he was there to win every time he could. The memories just kind of flow back in."

Best Pal raced from ages two to eight, earned more than \$5.6 million and won 18 races.

California-bred Luckarack remained unbeaten by taking the \$63,100 Cavonnier Juvenile Stakes at the Sonoma County Fair in Santa Rosa on August 14.



Luckarack is by Lucky Pulpit,

out of the graded stakes-placed Dehere mare Tamarack Bay, was bred by owners Larry and Marianne Williams and is trained by Steve Specht.

He has won all three of his starts, has earnings of \$40,300 and was coming off a win in the \$51,950 Nevin Alameda County Futurity on July 10.

Luckarack ran the six furlongs in 1:10.98 and won by 2 1/2-lengths at odds of 3-1.

Hezamazing Rolls At Araphahoe

California-bred Hezamazing cruised to an easy win in the \$50,000 Arapahoe Park Classic in Aurora, Colorado on Sunday, August 15.

Hezamazing is by Indy Film, out of the Ruhlmann mare She's Amazing, was bred by George Krikorian, is owned by Carlyle Rollins and trained by Rick Houghton.

He has six wins in 21 starts and earnings of \$109,827. He ran the 1 1/8 miles in 1:51.94 and won by 9 1/4-lengths at oddsof 5-1.

Santa Anita To Get Dirt Track By December, Stronach Says

The synthetic track era at Santa Anita Park will end this fall.

Frank Stronach, the Chairman of Santa Anita's parent company, Magna International Developments (MID), told a group of about 250 horsemen on August 18, that Santa Anita

will replace its existing Pro-Ride synthetic surface with a conventional dirt track after the conclusion of the Oak Tree Racing Association at Santa Anita meeting on October 31.

Stronach said the new dirt track would be in place "by the first week of December," well in advance of the opening of the winter-spring meeting at Santa Anita on December 26.

"We are committed to building a new dirt track," Stronach said, receiving a round of applause. "We will do it now. We will gather the engineering and look for the materials. After Oak Tree is finished, we will have the track in place by the first week of December. The horses can train over it and we can run over it on Dec. 26."

Stronach did not say what type of dirt would be installed, or from where the material will be acquired. Dennis Mills, Magna International chief executive officer, said Wednesday evening that bids for material are currently being collected and that a decision could be made in the next week.

Stronach spoke for 18 minutes, also discussing in broad terms ways



to better promote racing. During a 12-minute question and answer period, he said the installation of a dirt track will cost "\$5 to \$6 million."

Stronach's announcement came on the eve of a California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) meeting in which noted racetrack expert Dr. Mick

Peterson is scheduled to issue a preliminary report about the condition of the Santa Anita Pro-Ride track. In recent weeks, there has been concern among horsemen about the surface, with the focus on whether rocks have risen from the sub-surface into the upper layer of the surface. Peterson said in an interview last week that he felt the issue could be fixed before the start of the Oak Tree meeting on September 29.

The move to install a dirt track brings to an end a three-year period in which Santa Anita's races were run on two synthetic surfaces and encountered trouble with drainage. Acting on a mandate by the racing board, the track installed a Cushion Track brand surface in the summer of 2007, but the material was plagued by drainage problems, leading to the cancellation of 11 racing days.

A Pro-Ride brand surface was installed in the summer of 2008, but it too had drainage problems earlier this year, forcing the cancellation of five racing days.—Daily Racing Form, by Steve Andersen



On August 17, 1991, Wicked Wit, a daughter of Pirate's Bounty, won the \$50,000 Generous Portion Stakes for California-bred two-year-old fillies at the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club by one length over Bad Bad Rosa, with Wine 'n Music third in the field of six. Wicked Wit was trained by Danny Velasquez, ridden by Eddie Delahoussaye and ran the six furlongs in 1:10 3/5 at odds of 3-5. Wicked Wit was the fourth of five foals out of the Grenfall mare Wicked Fall, who also produced the stakes-winning One the Menus. The Generous Portion was Wicked Wit's second win in three starts and she won five more stakes and placed in four others. She finished his career with eight wins in 29 starts and earnings of \$320,170. Wicked Wit was bred by Martin Wygod at River Edge Farm and was owned by Morales, Pinner and Pinner.

Zenyatta Artwork To Benefit Rescues

Christine Picavet (www.ChristinePicavet.com), a French artist of international renown and a retired exercise rider who galloped horses for Hall of Fame trainer Charles Whittingham, has created and donated an oil painting of Zenyatta at Oaklawn Park to racehorse charity Southern California Thoroughbred Rescue (www.sctbrescue.org).

Southern California Thoroughbred Rescue is a 501(c) (3) non-profit organization devoted to the welfare and safety of "at risk" thoroughbred ex-racehorses. Since its inception in June 2008 the organization has provided shelter, rehabilitation and retraining services to approximately fifty thoroughbreds and currently cares for thirty two rescued animals.

The oil painting of Zenyatta measures 20"x24" inches (26"x30" framed) and is available for \$10,500. Picavet is also donating all proceeds from the sale of one

hundred numbered and signed prints of Zenyatta on archival paper or canvas (in limited quantity) for \$200 each.

The painting and prints were displayed in the Clubhouse at the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club on August 7, as part of a fundraiser that the seaside track graciously permitted.



The region's temperate climate allows for horses to live outdoors year-round, and the ranch's pastures range from two acres to almost 50 and follow the contours of the foothills.

To date, more than 200 stakes winners have been foaled and raised on the ranch's green fields. Others, like last year's Eclipse champion juvenile colt Valid Point, were brought to the ranch as yearlings for breaking and schooling. California Thoroughbred Ranch also has an excellent reputation as a training center. It



offers five round pens, an indoor riding arena and a scenic uphill gallop that winds its way through the facility. There are also two treadmills and a swimming pool, where lay-ups can regain their conditioning without risk of further injury.

The ranch is home to two of California' finest stallions. Supe

Dad is the sire of 22 graded stakes winners and countless other stakes performers. His champion daughter Daddy's Little Gal captured last year's Cal Cup Juvenile Fillies and this year's grade I Santa Anita Oaks. Moneymaker was foaled at the ranch and now stands at stud here. This graded stakes winner of nearly \$400,000 has thrust himself into the national spotlight when his son Hayburner captured this year's Travers Stakes at Saratoga. Winner of the Wood Memorial and second in both the Kentucky Derby and Preakness Stakes, Hayburner now has earnings over \$1 million. The Cal-bred is now pointing for the Breeders' Cup Classic.

Farm manager Bob Irainer has more than 30 years of experience in this business and gives your horses the personal care and attention they deserve. Assistant manager and yearling trainer Steve Winner also has many years of veterinary experience, although the farm's main vet lives just down the road and is on call 24 hours a day, especially during the busy foaling season. 
