## The Next Generation

Year after year, one of the most cherished rituals enjoyed by Thoroughbred breeders is watching with hopeful anticipation as springtime pastures begin to fill with playful newborns and their protective dams. This annual renewal occurs at farms of all sizes across the country, but nowhere more abundantly than in the rich bluegrass fields of Kentucky, the site of nearly one-third of all U.S. foal births.

In keeping with this tradition, many notable California-bred mares are romping alongside their newest offspring in Kentucky this year.

Among the first-time dams of 2008 is 2005 Test Stakes (grade I) winner and California Champion Three-Year-Old Female Leave Me Alone. This six-year-old daughter of Bold Badgett, a \$653,329-earner who was bred in the Golden State by Old English Rancho, Ann Quinn and Linda Pond and sold for \$35,000 at the 2003 CTBA Sales' Del Mar Yearling Sale, produced an A.P. Indy filly on Jan. 18. Named Independent Means, the youngster was bred by Summer Wind Farm, a nursery owned by Frank and Jane Lyon, who purchased Leave Me Alone for \$1 million at the 2007 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Selected Fall Mixed Sale.

Leave Me Alone was bred back to Smart Strike, North America's leading sire of 2007.

Also dropping her first foal this year was two-time grade III

winner Cambiocorsa, a six-year-old Avenue of Flags mare who won nine of 18 starts, including a remarkable string of six consecutive victories over Santa Anita Park's downhill turf course from November 2005 through April 2006. Bred by John and Diane Fradkin, she banked \$522,055 during her career and delivered a filly by 2004 Horse of the Year Ghostzapper on March 23 for breeder Ranjan Racing Inc.

A recipient of the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association's prestigious 2005/2006 Valkyr Trophy for racing achievements, Cambiocorsa is now in foal to 2007 Kentucky Derby (grade I) winner and first-year stallion Street Sense.

Another recent Valkyr Trophy honoree, 2004 La Brea Stakes (grade I) winner Alphabet Kisses, gave birth to her second foal, a first-crop filly by 2006 Eclipse Champion Three-Year-Old Bernardini, on March 28. A home-bred earner of \$590,270 for Harris Farms Inc., the seven-year-old Alphabet Soup mare had an Awesome Again colt last year.

James Weigel's durable grade I winner Dream of Summer, California's Champion Older Female of 2005, produced an Unbridled's Song colt, her second foal, on...

### Notional Ends Drought At Monmouth

California-bred Notional snapped a 17-month drought by winning the grade III, \$300,000 Salvator Mile Handicap at Monmouth Park on July 5.

Notional is by In Excess (Ire), out of the winning French Deputy mare Truly Blessed, was bred by and foaled at Vessels Stallion Farm in Bonsall, and is owned by Paul Reddam and trained by Mark Hennig.

A \$235,000 purchase at the 2006 Barretts March Sale of Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training, he now has four wins in 11 starts and earnings of \$695,740.

He ran the mile in 1:35.84 and won by 2 1/4 lengths at odds of 7-1. It was his first win since the grade III Risen Star Stakes on Feb. 10, 2007.

### Scrupy Takes Whiting

Favored Scrupy rallied along the rail to win the \$60,300 Sam J. Whiting Memorial Handicap at Pleasanton on July 4.

The five-year-old gelding is by Taskmaster, out of the winning Candi's Gold mare Sweet Dish, was bred in California by Stan Uragami and James Chapman, foaled at Special T Thoroughbreds in Temecula, the home of his sire, and owned by Lamonte Isom and trained by William E. Morey.

He has 12 wins in 21 starts and earnings of \$178,120 and he ran the six furlongs in 1:09.10, winning by 1 1/4 lengths at odds of 7-5.

### Group I Winner For Redattore

California freshman stallion Redattore (Brz) was represented by his first group I winner when Estrela do Oriente won the \$65,100 Grande Premio Associacao Brasileira de Criadores e Proprietarios do Cavalo de Corrida for two-year-olds at Gavea on June 29.

The winner, whose sire stands at Harris Farms in Coalinga, ran the mile on soft turf in 1:35.72.

### Gene Cunningham Passes At 88

Gene Cunningham, a longtime California horseman and the husband of California Thoroughbred Breeders Association President Leigh Ann Howard, passed away in Fallbrook on July 5. He was 88.

Born in Utah, Gene grew up in the desert community of Barstow. His father was a pharmacist and Gene and his younger brother, Jerry, also became pharmacists. Before the advent of the discount pharmacy chain stores, the personal attention by Gene, his brother and father at Cunningham Pharmacy was well known in Redlands, Barstow and San Bernardino.

He served his country with the Army in the medical corps during World War II, mostly in the Pacific Theater.

Gene had an adventurous side brought out during his college years at USC. He became familiar with the Hollywood scene and owned a duck gun club with Cornel Wilde, Emmett Steele and others in the area that became known as Rancho California.



Gene was also involved producing adventure films, the best known still being shown today is titled "Naked Prey."

He loved the Thoroughbred racehorse world. At one point, he owned several good runners and a breeding and layup farm in Murrieta, California. Gene developed a commercial national horse transportation company named Fox Hollow Inc. This company eventually became Hubbard Horse Transport.

He was well known in the cross-country horse-shipping business and acted as consigning agent for his and other shipping companies at horse sales all over the United States for many years.

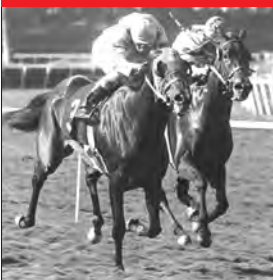
Gene leaves his wife, Leigh Ann Howard, sons George and Casey, sister Janie Mann, several grandchildren and nieces and nephews.

Gene Cunningham was a kind man who had great memories of the wonderful and exciting life he was fortunate to live. He requested there be no services in his honor but he did wish his friends would drink a toast in his memory, at their leisure.

## California-Bred Flashback

### Wishing Well

July 8, 1979



Wishing Well (#3)  
Convenience Stakes

On July 8, 1979, Wishing Well, a four-year-old daughter of Understanding, won the \$35,360 Convenience Stakes for fillies and mares at Hollywood Park, with Joe's Bee second and Diama finishing third in a field of six. Wishing Well was trained by Gary Jones and ridden by Fernando Toro. She ran the 1 1/8 miles on a firm turf course in 1:47 2/5 and won by one length at odds of even money. Wishing Well was the fifth of seven foals out of the Montparnasse (Arg) mare Mountain Flower. The Convenience was Wishing Well's third win in 16 starts. She later won the graded Gamely and Wilshire Handicaps, as well as the Las Cienegas and Autumn Days Handicaps, and finished her career with 12 wins in 38 starts and earnings of \$381,625. She was bred by George A. Pope Jr., foaled at his El Peco Ranch in Madera and owned by Michael Lima. Wishing Well's real claim to fame, however, was as a broodmare. In 1986, she foaled a colt by Halo who sold for \$32,000 at the CTBA's March sale for two-year-olds in 1988. His name was Sunday Silence and he went on to win the Kentucky Derby and Preakness and Breeders' Cup Classic Stakes and nearly \$5 million in purses, before becoming the dominant sire in Japan.
