

The 2012 Northern California Yearling Sale will be held Tuesday, August 14, at the Alameda County Fairgrounds in Pleasanton.

Entry forms will be mailed March 16 and the closing date for entries is Monday, April 9.

Since the sale returned under the direction of the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association (CTBA) in 2004, it has produced stakes winners such as Bai and Bai, an earner of \$724,983; grade II winner Sierra Sunset; and grade III winner Autism Awareness.

Hollywood Park Spring Stakes Schedule Set

The 73rd running of the \$500,000 Hollywood Gold Cup (grade I) and the American Oaks (grade I), to be increased from \$250,000 to \$400,000, headline a stakes schedule worth more than \$6.8 million for the 2012 spring/summer meet at Hollywood Park.

The 50-day season, featuring racing on a Thursday through Sunday regular schedule, begins April 26 and continues through July 15.

The opening weekend features Gold Rush XIII, the annual showcase for California-breds to be held April 28. The \$300,000 Snow Chief Stakes, at 1 1/8 miles, and the \$300,000 Melair Stakes are the main Gold Rush events. The Snow Chief, which is for three-year-olds, was worth \$150,000 in 2011 while the Melair, which

is for three-year-old fillies, had a \$125,000 purse a year ago. The other notable ark. Gold Rush stakes are the \$125,000 B. Thoughtful and \$125,000 Tiznow.

> At 1 1/4 miles over Cushion Track, the Gold Cup will be run July 7. Last year's race was won a year ago by First Dude in thrilling fashion over stablemate Game On Dude and favored Twirling Candy. The Gold Cup will be part of a stakes doubleheader with the \$150,000 Royal Heroine Mile (grade II) for older fillies and mares on turf.

> The American Oaks, which featured its first dead heat between Cambina and Nereid on its 10th anniversary in 2011, will be contested July 14. It is last of seven grade I events during the meet.—continued at www.bloodhorse.com, By Blood-Horse Staff




Cal-bred **Pair Bring** Six **Figures**

Bill Allows Sports Betting At California Tracks

A bill that would allow California racetracks and simulcast wagering facilities to conduct betting on professional and collegiate sporting events has been introduced in the state legislature.

The measure would also allow card clubs and tribal gaming casinos to conduct sports betting, a multi-billion dollar industry nationally, for the first time in the state.

Current federal law prohibits such wagering under the Professional and Amateur Sports Protection Act of 1992, but makes exceptions for the states of Montana, Oregon, Delaware, and Nevada.

New Jersey, which passed a law similar to the one proposed in California in January following approval by voters in a nonbinding referendum, plans to challenge the federal ban. It contends the act violates provisions under the commerce and equal protection clauses of the U.S. Constitution, according to a state senate consultant.

SB 1390 was introduced February 24 by Sen. Roderick Wright, Democratic chairman of the senate's governmental organization committee, which oversees horse racing and public gaming. The measure is expected to get a first hearing before the committee in April, according to Paul Donahue, a G.O. committee consultant who is preparing an analysis of the measure.

Wright's Southern California district includes Hollywood Park, which is in imminent danger of being razed for a large-scale commercial and residential redevelopment.—continued at www.bloodhorse.com, by Jack Shinar

USDA: Equine Operations Now Eligible For Emergency Loans

USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) Administrator Bruce Nelson announced February 29 that equine operations that breed, raise, and sell certain types of horses are now eligible for loan assistance under FSA's emergency loan program.

"To help keep American agriculture profitable, USDA immediately responds to disasters across the country—ranging from record floods, droughts, and tornadoes—with direct support, disaster assistance, technical assistance, and access to credit," said Nelson. "This policy modification will help certain equine operations when they face losses due to drought, flooding, other natural disasters or quarantine. A strong farm safety net, including emergency credit, is critical to sustain the success of American agriculture."—continued at www.bloodhorse.com

California-Bred Flashback: Foxy Envoy

On March 7, 1992, Foxy Envoy, a daughter of Tally Ho the Fox, won the \$30,000 Haitanga Handicap for fillies and mares at Golden Gate Fields, with Tasteful T. V. second and Dragonetta finishing third in a field of six. Foxy Envoy was trained by Greq Gilchrist and ridden by Russell Baze. She ran the five furlongs in :56 4/5 and won by three lengths at odds of 6-5. Foxy Envoy was the first of nine foals out of the Numa Pompilius mare Ambassadora, who also produced stakes-placed Tally Ho Express. The Haitanga was Foxy Envoy's sixth win in 28 starts. She also placed in three stakes and finished her career with 10 wins in 52 starts and earnings of \$233,527. As a broodmare, Foxy Envoy had six foals, three winners, including Highly Suspect, a stakes-placed winner of \$211.804. Foxy Envoy was bred by Dr. and Mrs. Richard Walter, Harry Aleo and was foaled at Kerr Stock Farm in Moreno Vallev.

CTBA Offers New Format For Magazine's Foal Photos

Starting with the April 2012 issue of California Thoroughbred, the official publication of the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association (CTBA), this year's crop of foals born in the Golden State will be included as full-page advertorials with each page featuring six foals from a specific Thoroughbred farm, including detailed information on every foal and that facility. For this service, a fee of \$500 per page will be charged, representing a discount of more than 50 percent on the

cost of a regular full-page advertisement in the monthly magazine.

The deadline for submitting photos of California-bred foals located at one farm in sets of five for a particular issue will be the first of the month prior to that magazine; March 5 for the April issue; April 6 for the May issue; May 7 for the June issue; June 4 for the July issue; and July 6 for the August issue. Evaluating Horse Feet, Legs, and Gaits

"I challenge you to every day to improve your powers of observation," began Ric Redden, DVM, founder of the International Equine Podiatry Center in Versailles, Kentucky, during the 2011 American Association of Equine Practitioners convention, held November 18-22 in San Antonio, Texas. "Believe half of what you see and everything you understand."

Redden explained his methods for evaluating foot flight and limb alignment in horses to the veterinarians in attendance. "This approach is beneficial for assessing horses of any age, from diagnosing limb deformities in foals to identifying potential high-risk factors in prepurchase exams of adult individuals," he said. "This methodical protocol allows us to better understand variations in distance and structural angles that fall within the range of normal, as well as alterations that are not compatible with soundness. Using a systematic, methodical approach for every exam offers a useful means of enhancing our ability to record small details that may otherwise be overlooked."—continued at www.bloodhorse.com, By Blood-Horse Staff

AHP Launches Second Equine Industry Survey

The American Horse Publications (AHP) is launching its second Equine Industry Survey to gauge trends in the U.S. equine industry. The AHP Equine Industry Survey is being sponsored by Kentucky Equine Research, Merck Animal Health, and Pfizer Animal Health.

In 2009, AHP conducted an online nationwide survey made possible by the sponsorship of Intervet/Schering Plough Animal Health and Pfizer Animal Health. Upon its conclusion on January 31, 2010, more than 11,170 usable responses were collected. This completed the largest equine industry survey of hands-on horse industry participants in the United States. The AHP is striving to exceed that number with the current survey.

As in the previous survey, the purpose of the 2012 survey is threefold. The first objective is to obtain information regarding past, present, and expected future participation in the equine industry. The second objective is to identify which issues currently facing the equine industry are perceived as being most critical to those who own, or manage horses. 
New Equine Fetal Sex Determination Technique Studied

Researchers at the Federal University of Pelotas, Brazil, recently completed a study identifying circulating cell-free fetal DNA (ccffDNA) to determine fetal gender in pregnant mares. While ccffDNA has already been explored in humans, this is the first study to successfully demonstrate its presence ccffDNAand thus aid in sex determination—in horses.

Generally, veterinarians determine fetal sextyping via transrectal or transabdominal ultrasound of the mare. Horse Racing Industry In Ontario Under Fire

Seeking to reduce its \$16 billion deficit, the Ontario government is considering one of economist Don Drummond's recommendations to cut the "Slots at Racetracks" program, which could result in the downfall of horse racing in Ontario.

Slot machines were instituted at Ontario racetracks—both Standardbred and Thoroughbred—in the late 1990s. At that time the racetrack industry and government negotiated an agreement that required a portion (20 percent) of slot revenues be directed to the racing industry.

"The stated goals of the Slots at Racetracks program was to enhance live racing and subsequently benefit the agricultural sector in Ontario," said Ontario Harness Horse Association General Manager Brian Tropea. "This arrangement has been beneficial for everyone and has allowed the racing industry to prosper."—<u>continued at www.bloodhorse.com</u>, By Stacey Oke, DVM, MSc

Utah Bill Would Ban Unauthorized Photography On Farms

Those who photograph or videotape conditions at livestock operations without farm owners' consent could be criminally prosecuted if a bill now pending in the Utah legislature becomes law.

Sponsored by Utah State Rep. John Mathis, DVM, HB 187 (the Agricultural Operation Interference bill) would forbid anyone from recording still or videotaped images and sounds at agricultural operations used to produce livestock, poultry, livestock products, or poultry products without the expressed permission of the farm's owner or the owner's agent. If the bill becomes law, violators could face misdemeanor criminal charges.

Members of the Utah House of Representatives approved HB187 by a 60-14 margin. The bill was introduced into the State Senate on February 28.—continued at www.thehorse.com, by: Pat Raia.






