Ancient Title Elected To Racing Hall Of Fame

Ancient Title, who won 20 stakes races and earned \$1,252,791 during seven racing seasons, has become the fifth California-bred to be elected to the National Thoroughbred Racing Hall of Fame in Saratoga Springs, New York.

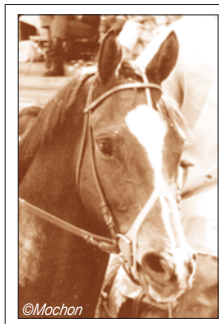
One of the outstanding runners of the 1970s, the durable and versatile gelding included the 1975 Californian Stakes and Hollywood Gold Cup Invitational Handicap at Hollywood Park, both grade I events, and the grade II Whitney Handicap at Saratoga Race Course among his 24 overall victories in 57 starts from 1972 to 1978.

He was voted to racing's shrine on April 21, by a special Historical Review Committee which considers candidates who have not been active in Thoroughbred racing for at least 25 years.

Ancient Title joins 19th century champion Emperor of Norfolk, 1955 Kentucky Derby winner Swaps, Native Diver—winner of three consecutive runnings of the Hollywood Gold Cup from 1966 to 1968—and steeplechase champion Café Prince as the only Cal-breds in the Hall of Fame.

"I thought he should have gotten in before this," said Keith Stucki, Ancient Title's trainer, who lives in retirement in Bradbury, California, and turns 89 on May 26. "But I'm glad to see him finally make it."

"We're grateful my dad is still alive to see Ancient Title get in the Hall of Fame," said Veronica, known as "Charlie," one of the trainer's three daughters, who shares a home with her father and husband Danny Mitchell, a retired Quarter Horse jockey. "This means so much to the whole family."



Bred and owned by the late Bill and Ethel Kirkland of West Covina, California, Ancient Title was foaled at Three Rings Ranch in Beaumont on Jan. 19, 1970, and named for Baron Von Arenscheidt, a German nobleman who was Ethel Kirkland's grandfather.

Lynn Meyers, one of the Kirklands' three granddaughters, recalled watching the two-time California Horse of the Year in action as a young married woman and mother.

"My grandfather was in the asphalt paving business, but his big love was his horses," said Meyers who with her with husband Donald are residents of tiny Montague, California, in Siskiyou County, just south of the Oregon border.

"Both my grandparents died a long time ago, but wherever they are I know they're thrilled the horse got in the Hall of Fame."

A dark bay or brown son of leading sire Gummo, Ancient Title was out of the winning Bar Le Duc mare Hi Little Gal, also trained by Stucki during his career of more than 40 years on the racetrack.

The new Hall of Famer came to prominence as a two-year-old in 1972, when he won both the Sunny Slope and California Breeders' Champion Stakes at Santa Anita Park. As a four-year-old in 1974, following two graded stakes wins the previous year, he swept Santa Anita's three-race Strub Series, while he achieved his final stakes success at eight in the Arcadia track's. . .

Wind Water, the lone California-bred in the field, overcame a bobble at the start to score a head win over Sing Baby Sing in the \$50,000 Ford Express Stakes at Lone Star Park in Grand Prairie, Texas, on May 16.

Wind Water is by Bold Badgett out of the winning French Deputy mare Feng Shui, was bred by Larry and Sheila Ullmann’s SLU Inc. and foaled at Old English Rancho, and is owned by Adam Lewis and trained by Chris Hartman. He has 16 wins in 43 starts, earnings of \$639,351 and was coming off an Apr. 15 allowance win. He ran the six furlongs in 1:08.80 and went off as the 11-10 favorite.

California-bred Nevada Worrier rallied four-wide and dug in during a stretch-long duel to win the \$61,900 Golden Bear Stakes for three-year-olds at Golden Gate Fields in Albany on May 17.

Nevada Worrier is by Lord Carson out of the winning Marquetry mare Preppy Squaw, was bred by owner Joseph Duffel and foaled at his Duffel Farms, and is trained by Jerry Wallace II.

The graduate of the 2007 Barretts May Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training has three wins in 14 starts, earnings of \$176,043 and was coming off a fifth in the April 25 Harry Henson Stakes.

He ran the six furlongs in 1:09.98 and defeated Devil’s Afleet by a neck at odds of 5-1.

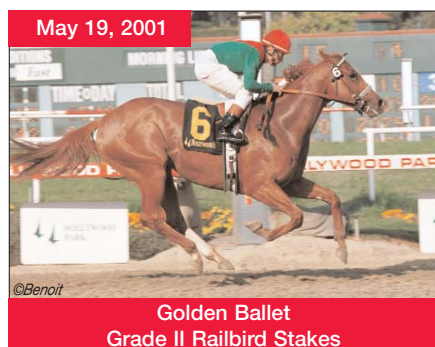
Northern California Yearling Sale

On May 19, 2001, Golden Ballet, a California-bred daughter of Moscow Ballet, won the grade II, \$150,000 Railbird Stakes for three-year-old fillies at Hollywood Park, with Starrer finishing second and Pretty n’ Smart finishing third in a field of six. Golden Ballet was trained by Janine Sahadi and ridden by Chris McCarron. She ran the seven furlongs on a fast track in 1:21 2/5 and won by four lengths at odds of 1-10. Golden Ballet is the sixth of 13 foals out of the unraced Slew O’Gold mare Golden Jewel Box. The Railbird was Golden Ballet’s sixth win in her tenth and last start. She also won the grade I Las Virgenes Stakes and Santa Anita Oaks and earned \$732,145. She was bred by Jerry Dutton and Vladimir Popovich, foaled at Rancho Del Charro and owned by Heiligbrodt Racing Stable and Team Valor.

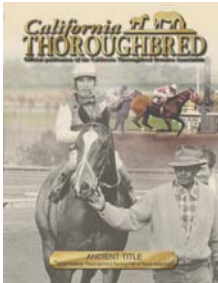
