### REMINDER: TUESDAY, DECEMBER 1st Is The 2009 CTBA Stallion Season Auction

Breedings to Salt Lake, Stormin Fever and Surf Cat have been added to the lineup for this year's California Thoroughbred Breeders Association stallion season auction, to be held Tuesday, December 1, from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. Salt Lake and Stormin Fever stand at Golden Eagle Farm. Surf Cat stands at Old English Rancho.

The auction also includes Unusual Heat, a son of Nureyev, stands at Old English Rancho. He has nine crops with earnings of more than \$20 million, including stakes winners Unusual Suspect, Lethal Heat, Golden Doc A, Tucked Away and Bel Air Sizzle.

At least 74 stallions will be represented in the auction, including perennial favorites In Excess and Swiss Yodeler.

Proceeds from the auction, which features seasons for many of the state's top sires, benefit the CTBA's Political Action Committee Fund, which works in support of legislation that favorably impacts California Thoroughbred breeders.

Bid sheets will be available online and will also be mailed this week. The bid sheets need to be received by mail or fax no later than November 30th. Bids will be opened the day of the telephone auction with bidding to start with the highest figure. Bidders will be notified of the highest starting bid. Only active bidders will be notified of changing bids. The minimum bid will be \$500 with a \$100 minimum raise per bid, which will be in effect during the telephone auction.

Each bidder will be notified of any increase in the bidding.

All seasons are offered with no guarantee and season rights will be lost if payment is not received within 30 days. To participate, call (626) 445-7800 during auction hours.

### Cal-bred Quartet Sells at Keeneland

Four California-bred mares were six-figure purchases at the recently concluded Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale in Lexington, Kentucky.

Lightmyfirebaby, consigned by Taylor Made Sales, sold for \$400,000 to NofA Equestrian Resort. She won the Grade III Las Cienegas Handicap, the California Cup Distaff and \$444,437 in earnings. She is in foal to Unbridled's Song.

Memorette, consigned by Valkyre Stud, agent for Mr. and Mrs. William Currin, sold for \$270,000 to Dixiana Farm. She won the Grade II Beverly Hills Handicap, Fran's Valentine Stakes and \$896,753 in earnings. She is in foal to Curlin.

Royally Chosen, consigned by Adena Springs, sold for \$200,000 to I.T.C. She won the California Cup Matron, B. Thoughtful Stakes and \$594,175 in earnings. She is in foal to Ghostzapper.

Rushen Heat, consigned by Warrendale Sales, sold for \$160,000 to Marc Keller, Nicoma, agent. She was second in the California Cup Distance, has earnings of \$179,901 and is a full sister to graded winners Golden Doc A and Unusual Suspect. She is in foal to Henrythenavigator.

### Marino Marini Gets First Stakes Winner

California-bred Shuacudawudya, after clipping heels and stumbling when cut off at the five-sixteenths, regrouped to wear down the frontrunners and won the \$62,900 Golden Nugget Stakes for 2-year-olds at Golden Gate Fields on Saturday, November 21st.



Shuacudawudya is the first stakes winner by Marino Marini, out of the Cutlass Reality mare Sunny Miss, was bred by owner Brett Mason and is trained by Lloyd Mason.

He has three wins and two seconds in five starts, earnings of \$71,180 and was coming off a second in an Oct. 31 optional claimer.

He ran the six furlongs in 1:09.46 and won by three-quarters of a length at odds of 9-1.

### Southern Image Relocates To Rancho San Miguel

Rancho San Miguel announced that Southern Image will join their stallion roster for the 2010 breeding season.

The 9-year-old son of Halo's Image out of Pleasant Dixie, by Dixieland Band is a three-time Grade I-winning millionaire. He won the Grade I Malibu as a 3-year-old, the \$1,000,000 Grade I Santa Anita Handicap, and the Grade I Pimlico Special, earning a 118 Beyer Figure.

Southern Image also won the Sunshine Millions Classic and had career earnings of \$1,843,750 from his six wins in eight starts, having never run off the board. Mike Machowsky, who trained Southern Image, said, "He had all the attributes of a great race horse, precocity, versatility, consistency and the will to win. I believe he will pass on those traits to his foals."

His first foals are 2-year-olds of 2009 and have already won more than \$280,000, ranking him California's leading freshman sire by progeny earnings, stakes performers and juvenile winners.

Southern Image has 11 winners to date, including Hollywood Park track record setter Southern Fireball and stakes horses Privileged, Best Be Quick and Winning Image. He has 334 foals from his first three seasons standing in North America and Australia.

### California-Bred Flashback

#### Calestoga

Nov. 24, 1988, Calestoga, a son of Relaunch, won the \$100,000 On Trust Handicap at Hollywood Park by 1 1/4 lengths over Stylish Winner, with Mark Chip finishing third in the field of eight. Calestoga was trained by Neil Boyce, ridden by Eddie Delahoussaye and ran the mile in 1:36 at odds of 7-5. Calestoga was the third of 10 foals out of the Montparnasse II mare Vitelle. The On Trust was Calestoga's 20th win in 44 starts. He ran only one more time, finishing his career with 11 stakes wins and earnings of \$651,225. He was bred by Louis Rowan and Leonard Lavin, was foaled at Summit Lake Farm in Lemoore and was owned by N. & M. Boyce Racing Stable Inc. and Fox Valley Inc.
